<p>REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITANCE TO THE EXAMINATION</p>	<p>All applicants must meet the minimum qualifications for this examination at the time of filing.</p>
<p>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</p>	<p><u>Speech Pathologist I</u> Possession of a valid license to practice speech pathology in California as determined by the Speech Pathology and Audiology Examining Committee of the California Board of Medical Quality Assurance. (Includes possession of a Master's Degree in Speech Pathology or deemed equivalent as defined by the Speech Pathology and Audiology Examining Committee.) (Applicants who are in the process of securing approval of their qualifications by the Speech Pathology and Audiology Examining Committee will be admitted to the examination but they must meet all the legal requirements in order to be eligible for appointment.)</p>
<p>EXAMINATION PLAN</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE - WEIGHTED 100%</p> <p>This examination will consist solely of an evaluation of each candidate's experience and/or education compared to a standard developed from the class specification. For this reason, it is especially important that each candidate take special care to accurately complete their application. List all experience(s) relevant to the "Minimum Qualifications" shown on this announcement. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70.00% must be attained.</p>
<p>ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION</p>	<p>The resulting eligible lists will be established to fill vacancies for the CPHCS. Names of successful competitors are merged into the lists in order of final scores, regardless of date. Eligibility expires 12 months after establishment, unless the needs of the service and conditions of the lists warrant a change in this period.</p>
<p>SPECIAL TESTING ARRANGEMENTS</p>	<p>If you have a disability and need special testing arrangements, mark the appropriate box in Part 2 of the "Examination Application." You will be contacted to make specific arrangements.</p>
<p>POSITION DESCRIPTION</p>	<p>Speech Pathologist I: This is the working level. Under direction, incumbents in this class administer diagnostic tests to determine the nature and extent of speech disorders; provide individual and group speech therapy services to residents; prepare reports and summaries on diagnosis, prognosis, progress, and recommendations for assigned cases; confer with teachers, parents, and employees regarding progress and treatment; train parents and ward or unit employees in therapeutic procedures and methods of motivating residents related to speech therapy; attend clinics and keep notes; develop and direct research projects; and may supervise the work of Speech Pathologist License Applicants.</p>
<p>VETERANS PREFERENCE</p>	<p>Veteran's Preference credit will be added to the final score of those competitors who are successful in this examination, and who qualify for and have requested these credits. Due to the changes in the law, effective January 1, 1996, VETERANS WHO ACHIEVE PERMANENT CIVIL SERVICE STATUS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE VETERANS CREDITS.</p>

GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the candidate's responsibility to contact the **CPHCS, Selection Services Section at (916) 445-1419** three weeks after mailing his/her application if he/she has not received a progress notice.

Applications are available at the CPHCS offices, local offices of the Employment Development Department and the State Personnel Board. The application can also be downloaded from the State Personnel Board's website at www.spb.ca.gov.

If you meet the requirements stated on the reverse, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination described on the other side of this bulletin will be compared with the performance of the others who take this test, and all candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

The CPHCS reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) subdivisional promotional; 2) departmental promotional; 3) multidepartmental promotional; 4) servicewide promotional; 5) departmental open; and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire from one to four years unless otherwise stated in this bulletin.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history, and fingerprinting may be required.
