NOTE: Only applications with an original signature will be accepted.

APPLICATION DEADLINE/ TESTING PERIOD Applications will be accepted on a continuous basis. All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination at the time he or she files his or her application.

The testing period for this examination is six (6) months. Once you have taken the Training and Experience Assessment examination, you may not retest for six (6) months.

SALARY RANGE **As of July 1, 2007:**
\$6,964 - \$8,465 Monthly – This salary applies to the Public Health Nurse I, CF appointed to all Adult Institutions and California Prison Health Care Services (CPHCS), **except** for San Quentin State Prison, Salinas Valley State Prison, and the Correctional Training Facility, Soledad.

\$7,676 - \$9,331 Monthly – This salary applies **only** for the Public Health Nurse I - CF, appointed to San Quentin State Prison, Salinas Valley State Prison, and the Correctional Training Facility, Soledad.

Base Salary
\$4,916 - \$6,847 Monthly

NOTE: The Division of Juvenile Justice does not use this classification.

**MINIMUM
QUALIFICATIONS**

License/Certificate: Possession of a current license as a Registered Nurse in California and a current certificate as a Public Health Nurse in California. (Applicants who do not meet these requirements will be admitted to the examination, but they must secure the required license and certificate before they will be considered eligible for appointment.)

Special Personal Characteristics: Empathetic understanding of patients of a State correctional facility; willingness to work in a state correctional facility; emotional stability; patience; tact; alertness; and keenness of observation.

Special Physical Characteristics: Persons appointed to this position must be reasonably expected to have and maintain sufficient strength, agility and endurance to perform during stressful (physical, mental and emotional) situations encountered on the job without compromising their health and well-being or that of their fellow employees or that of inmates and/or wards.

Assignments may include sole responsibility for the supervision of inmates and/or the protection of personal and real property.

NOTE: Applicants possessing the required license/certificate at the time of application must show number, title, and expiration date on their examination application.

EXAMINATION PLAN

This examination will consist of Training and Experience Assessment (supplemental application) weighted 100%. To obtain a position on the eligible list, applicants must achieve a minimum rating of 70% on the Supplemental Application. See section titled "How to Apply" for information on where to obtain a copy of the Supplemental Application and other needed materials.

Candidates who meet the "Minimum Qualifications" will have their Supplemental Application graded. If they pass the examination, they will be placed on an eligible list. **RETURN OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION IS MANDATORY.** Candidates who do not return the completed supplemental application will be eliminated from this examination.

Training and Experience Assessment (Supplemental Application) -- Weighted 100.00%

Scope: Emphasis in the examination will be on measuring competitively, relative to job demands, each candidate's:

- A. Knowledge of:
 - 1. Principles, methods, and procedures of nursing as applied in public health practice and of preventive medicine.
 - 2. Causes, transmission, and methods of control of communicable diseases, including tuberculosis and hepatitis, and sexually transmitted diseases including AIDS.
 - 3. Essential diagnostic and therapeutic problems involved in the control of communicable diseases and sexually transmitted diseases.
 - 4. Principles and purposes of public health programs.
 - 5. Socioeconomic problems of inmate population including the disabled.
 - 6. Long-term effects of chronic diseases.
 - 7. Principles of mental health.
- B. Ability to:
 - 1. Work effectively with staff, inmates and families in satisfactory solution of health programs.
 - 2. Work autonomously and in collaboration with other health professionals.
 - 3. Establish and maintain cooperative relations with intra- and interdepartmental agencies and other public and private health agencies.
 - 4. Analyze situations accurately and take effective action.
 - 5. Communicate effectively.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

An open merged eligible list will be established for CPHCS. The names of successful competitors will be merged onto the eligible list in order of final scores regardless of test date. Eligibility expires 12 months after it is established. Competitors must then retake the Training and Experience Assessment to re-establish eligibility.

POSITION DESCRIPTIONS AND LOCATION(S)

The Public Health Nurse I, CF is the entry level in this series. Under supervision, to perform public health nursing services including the prevention and control of communicable diseases and sexually transmitted diseases, epidemiological investigations, teaching inmates and staff prevention of the spread of infection; implement infectious disease control procedures; participate in conferences on community/public health problems; act as liaison with State and local county health departments and other appropriate health organizations on infectious disease control issues; assist with the development of policies and procedures on infectious disease issues; keeping records and prepare reports.

Positions exist statewide with the California Prison Health Care Services.

VETERANS POINTS/ CAREER CREDITS

Veteran's Preference Points will be granted in this examination. Due to changes in the law, which were effective January 1, 1996, veterans who have achieved permanent civil service status are not eligible to receive Veteran's Preference Points. Career Credits will not be granted in this examination.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Applications are available at the State Personnel Board or their website at spb.ca.gov, local offices of the Employment Development Department, and at the California Prison Health Care Services.

If you meet the requirements stated in this bulletin, you may take this examination. Possession of the entrance requirement(s) does not assure a place on the eligible list. All candidates who pass the examination described in this bulletin will be ranked according to their scores.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by a competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) subdivisional promotional; 2) departmental promotional; 3) multi-departmental promotional; 4) servicewide promotional; 5) departmental open; 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first.

The California Prison Health Care Services reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revisions will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

General Qualifications: Competitors must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, an investigation may be made of employment records and personal history, and fingerprinting may be required.

High School Equivalence: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Educational Development (GED) test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work; 3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the candidate is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis (high school is four years).

Veteran's Preference: California law allows the granting of Veteran's Preference Points in Open Entrance and Open, Nonpromotional Entrance examinations. Veteran's Preference Points will be added to the final score of all competitors who are successful in these types of examinations and qualify for and have requested these points. Credit in Open Entrance examinations is granted as follows: 10 points for veterans, widows and widowers of veterans, and spouses of 100% disabled veterans; and 15 points for disabled veterans. Credit in Open, Nonpromotional Entrance examinations is granted as follows: 5 points for veterans; and 10 points for disabled veterans. Directions to apply for Veteran's Preference Points are on the Veteran's Preference Application (Std. Form 1093) which is available from State Personnel Board, 801 Capitol Mall, Sacramento, CA 95814 and the Department of Veteran's Affairs, P. O. Box 942895, Sacramento, CA 94295-0001.
