SACRAMENTO COUNTY RIO COSUMNES CORRECTIONAL CENTER

ICDTP EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA (Per OSATS ICDTP Policies and Procedures - Policy #8.00)

Parolees who are unwilling to participate in the program

Parolees who are required to register pursuant to PC 290 and/or PC 457.1

Parolees with any conviction for an offense under PC 667.5(c) or who are who are CDCR-validated gang members shall be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Civil Narcotic Addicts

Active or potential United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (USICE) detainees

Felony holds or warrants that may result in additional incarceration following the inmate's release from CDCR custody

Parolees pending court adjudication on open cases and who possibly will be required to complete county jail time.

Interstate cases

Local Jail Facility Restrictions (see below)

LOCAL JAIL EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA

Any medical condition requiring housing in the Medical Housing Unit or special pod (i.e., wheelchair, cane, walker, insulin-dependent diabetic, C-PAP machine)

Any psychiatric patient who is unable to be housed in general population (i.e., requires acute or sub-acute housing in a psychiatric pod or unit).

Parolees who need on-going medical/dental treatment requiring transport to special care facilities or cases which would be a burden to jail staff

Southern Mexican gang members

Any parolee requiring special housing outside general population [i.e., Total Separation, Administrative Segregation, Protective Custody, Gang Dropouts]

Any inmate with in-custody history of assaultive or disciplinary behavior

Parolee convicted of PC243(c), 245(c), 245.2, 245.3, 245.5 (battery/ADW on Peace Officers/Fireman/Custodial Staffs/School Employees)

Parolee with history of escape or attempted escape

Parolees who have been housed on Sensitive Needs Yards (SNY)

MERCED COUNTY - JOHN LATORRACA CORRECTIONS CENTER

ICDTP EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA (Per OSATS ICDTP Policies and Procedures - Policy #8.00)

Parolees who are unwilling to participate in the program

Parolees who are required to register pursuant to PC 290 and/or PC 457.1

Parolees with any conviction for an offense under PC 667.5(c) or who are who are CDCR-validated gang members shall be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Civil Narcotic Addicts

Active or potential United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (USICE) detainees

Felony holds or warrants that may result in additional incarceration following the inmate's release from CDCR custody

LOCAL JAIL EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA

No Bull Dog gang members.

No participants on psychiatric medication.

No outstanding warrants.

No complex medication issues or complex medical issues (No benadryl, Neurontin, Belladonna, Vistaril, Vicodin). This list is not all inclusive but would include any medication used to assist in withdrawal symptoms related to substance abuse addictions. All parolee's prescribed such medication must be screened and approved by the Medical Administrator for the Sheriff Department and they have indicated that these parolees will not be accepted at the Merced ICDTP.

Keep in mind, cases which require ongoing medical/dental treatment would not be good candidates for this program and will be denied into the Merced ICDTP with pre-existing medical/dental needs. It would place a burden on jail staff and they would not receive full benefit from the program due to absences (they are only allowed a certain number of absences from class before being discharged). Also, cases which are pending court/local charges, or have active warrants would also not be good candidates for the same reason.

Parolee's that are within a 120 days of their Controlling Discharge Date are not recommended due to imminent discharge. DARS has noted that funding stops effective upon a parolees discharge date. Our provider, Westcare, has indicated that it would not be in the best interest of the participants clinically, nor the program, to place the participants in treatment with an imminent discharge date while in treatment.

Any CCCMS case should be stable and **not taking psychiatric medication.**

KERN COUNTY - LERDO FACILITY & SNY (Sensitive Needs Yard)

ICDTP EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA (Per OSATS ICDTP Policies and Procedures - Policy #8.00)

Parolees who are unwilling to participate in the program

Parolees who are required to register pursuant to PC 290 and/or PC 457.1

Parolees with any conviction for an offense under PC 667.5(c) or who are who are CDCR-validated gang members shall be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

LOCAL JAIL EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA

No Active Gang Members

No protective custody cases (alternative lifestyle individuals are placed into protective custody).

No Parolees which require ongoing medical/dental treatment requiring transport to special care facilities or cases which would be a burden to jail staff.

EOP on a case by case basis and must be screened with the DRU PSA or ICDTP PA II.

The restrictions for the SNY ICDTP program are the same as the Lerdo Facility with the exception of protective custody cases. Please pre-screen the SNY cases with the OSATS PSA at the DRU or the Kern ICDTP PA II prior to placement.

DEL NORTE COUNTY JAIL

ICDTP EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA (Per OSATS ICDTP Policies and Procedures - Policy #8.00)

Parolees who are unwilling to participate in the program

Parolees who are required to register pursuant to PC 290 and/or PC 457.1

Parolees with any conviction for an offense under PC 667.5(c) or who are who are CDCR-validated gang members shall be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

LOCAL JAIL EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA

No Protective Custody (PC) Cases.

No Severe EOPs.

No major ongoing dental problem. If Del Norte believes the dental is costly, then they will reject.

No Severe CCCMS. Parolees with extensive need for psychiatric medication.

No outstanding warrant. If the warrant appears once they are at the facility, Del Norte has been willing to keep the Parolee , until the Parolee is picked up.

No Major Medical Problems. Del Norte has been rejecting Parolees with extensive ongoing medical needs; ie Parolees with HIV, Heart Conditions, Psychiatric Meds. In short, medical conditions that may require them to spend for what they perceive as "expensive" medical care.

Del Norte is willing to accept Parolees outside the area. Their main concern are Parolees with major medical problems that they deem as being expensive.
