Program Information:

AmeriCorps Restoring Youth and Communities is offering full-time service positions over eleven months that provide a living allowance, health and child care benefits, and an educational award upon completion of service.

AmeriCorps Members will be recruited primarily from the ranks of individuals who care about the successful rehabilitation of youthful offenders and those who have experienced such challenges in their lives, including those who have been discharged from the California Department of Corrections, Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) – the former California Youth Authority.

AmeriCorps Members will serve in DJJ institutions and parole offices across the state coaching DJJ youth on identifying and learning about community issues they care about, helping them design and implement service-learning projects that tackle these issues, and recruiting adult volunteers and community based organizations to support their service-learning efforts.

AmeriCorps Members will be assisted with exploring career and academic pursuits in the field of juvenile justice.

This application asks you to describe the skills and experience you would bring to the program, as well as reasons why you hope to be selected. Consider each section carefully and respond to the best of your ability. Think about your role in service activities, participation in community organizations, academic experiences and personal talents. Take into account everything from your past and present.
