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Recreation

The Recreation Program offers various activities for the inmate population. Activities include intramural leagues and tournaments in both team and individual sports, board games, courses on personal health and fitness, and the screening of a selection of commercially produced motion pictures.

Location(s): All Institutions

Length of Program: Recreational activities are available to inmates year-round. Intramural leagues and tournaments will have a posted schedule and will vary in type and duration at each institution.

Enrollment: Approximately 45,000 inmates participate in recreation-sponsored tournaments and activities on a monthly basis.

Eligibility Requirements: Recreational activities are available to all inmates and will vary dependent upon an inmate's programming status and individual needs.

CDCR's Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP) manages adult inmate and parolee rehabilitative programs. Its top priority is to provide rehabilitative programming and life skills to offenders in an effort to reduce their likelihood of reoffending after their release from prison. DRP is comprised of the Office of Offender Services (OS), the Office of Correctional Education (OCE), and the Office of Program Accountability and Support (OPAS).

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
