DEFINITIONS

Civil Narcotic Addict (CNA): An offender civilly committed to CDCR for treatment of narcotic addiction. See Welfare and Institutions Code section 3000, et seq..

Determinate Sentencing Law (DSL): Most offenders are sentenced to California state prison for a set amount of time under the Determinate Sentencing Law. Once this time is served, the inmate is released.

Felon: A person convicted of a felony offense and sentenced to state prison by the court.

Felon New Admission: The first commitment from court for a felon.

Lifer (L): Life Sentence with the Possibility of Parole.

Life W/O (W): Life Sentence without the Possibility of Parole.

Parole Violator Returned With a New Term (PV-WNT): A parolee who has received a court sentence for a new crime and been returned to prison.

Parole Violator Returned to Custody (PV-RTC): A parolee who violated a condition of parole and was returned to CDCR.

Pending Revocation (PEND REV): A parolee who has been charged with violating a condition of parole and placed in CDCR custody pending investigation to determine if revocation time will be assessed.

2nd Striker (2): Penal Code Section 667 (b)-(i), specifically (e)(1), indicates a defendant who has *one prior serious or violent* felony conviction that has been pled and proven in court and who is *convicted of any new offense* results in the new term being doubled. Case law permits the prosecutor to look at the underlying factors of the prior offenses when proving the conviction. It does not matter if the new offense is serious or violent as it is the prior serious/violent offense that causes the new term to be doubled. A judge has the ability to strike a strike if the action is deemed appropriate. These persons are referred to as **Second Strikers**. The Legal Status Summaries for these inmates will reflect a “2” by the number of strikes to denote they are Second Strikers in that their term was doubled. These inmates will be released on their Earliest Possible Release Date. These inmates do not appear before the Board of Prison Hearings; their release is governed by application of the sentencing laws.

3rd Striker (3): Penal Code Section 667 (b)-(i), specifically (e)(2)(A), states a defendant who has *two or more prior serious or violent felony convictions* pled and proven in court and who is *convicted of any new offense* results in the new term being tripled with a minimum sentence being 25 years. If it is determined by the court pursuant to Section 1170 for the underlying conviction, including any enhancement, the maximum term is Life. A judge has the ability to strike a strike if the action is deemed appropriate. These persons are referred to as a Third Striker. The Legal Status Summaries for these inmates will reflect a “3” by the number of strikes to denote they are Third Strikers in that their maximum term is Life and the minimum term is as stated above. These inmates must be found suitable for parole by the Board of Prison Hearings and granted a parole date before they can be released from prison.
