## Safety in a Correctional Setting

When you think about working in a correctional setting, one of the first things that you probably think about is *how safe is it?* Many potential candidates ask recruiters, "How safe it is? Isn't there a high risk of being assaulted or harmed by an inmate? Will I be safe?"

The reality of working in a correctional setting is that the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation provides employees with a safe and secure work environment. Correctional facilities are **highly controlled environments** where inmates are closely monitored.

The Department provides specialized, on-going training for peace officers and all employees receive training on the rules, regulations, policies, and procedures. There are Correctional Officers assigned to every area of the facility **to ensure your safety** and trained officers are always on duty. Also, you will be assigned a personal alarm that you will utilize, if needed, and you will have immediate assistance from the custody staff.

"It is safe, if not safer, to work in a correctional facility as a teacher than anywhere else. I have known of many teachers who have been assaulted in public schools. After 8 years of teaching in a prison, I have yet to either meet or hear of a teacher being assaulted in a prison. All teachers are trained on how to act during emergency situations. We are also equipped with a Personal Alarm Device and a whistle. In my 8 years, I have only had to 'push the button' of my PAD once; and that was for help breaking up a fight. Trained and equipped officers arrived within seconds and dealt with the problem."
