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## PACT Orientation

- Reduce crime and improve supervised persons' access to needed services in the community.
- Service providers with community resources
- Established in each parole district statewide
- Conducted once a month for approximately 2 hours.

### Purpose

Creating partnerships with local law enforcement agencies, community service providers, and social service agencies

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## Mission of PACT

Providing resources

- DAPO provides supervised persons with timely information about community resources and required programming.
- Improves public safety.
- Promotes successful reintegration into the community.

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## PACT Policy

Clear expectations to ensure consistency in contributing to a safe and productive environment

**Parole Unit – Parole Service Associate**

- Provide assistance with liaising between parole unit and Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP) contracted program staff

**Recruit local service agencies/contractors**

- Provide resources:
  - Substance use disorder treatment
  - Transitional living
  - Employment services
  - Subsistence resources (clothing, meals, and transportation)
  - Educational/vocational training
  - Other identified resources to assist with the supervised person's needs

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## Parole Unit Staff

Collaboration

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### Lines of Responsibility



- District Administrator**
  - Ensure PACT Meetings are occurring within their areas of coverage
  - Attend PACT in their geographical area when appropriate
  - Provide DAPO headquarters PACT activities via chain of command
- Unit Supervisor**
  - Assist CRU PA II Specialist facilitating community resources in their jurisdictional areas
  - Ensure PAIs within their parole units refer supervised persons to PACT
  - Referrals and enrollment follow-ups in DRP contracted programs, community-based treatment programs, and PACT occur within their parole units
- Assistant Unit Supervisor**
  - Approve referrals for PACT resources
  - Coordinate program and resource follow-ups with the PAIs and PSAs assigned to their parole unit
  - Ensure one PAI from their respective unit attends each PACT
- Parole Agent I**
  - Complete CDCR Form 2256 and provide copy to supervised person to attend PACT after initial interview
  - Complete PACT referral in the Parole Violation Disposition Tracking System
  - Attend PACT and provide support to CRU PA II Specialist
- Parole Service Associate**
  - Assist CRU PA II Specialist with facilitation and coordination of PACT
  - Act as liaison between DAPO, DRP, local agencies, and contracted community-based program(s)
  - Recruit community resource organizations to participate in PACT
  - Collect CDCR Form 2256 PACT Orientation Meeting Notice to monitor referrals and attendance

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### Lines of Responsibility



- Parole Agent III**
  - Negotiate PACT Partnership Agreements with community agencies within jurisdictional area
  - Ensure CRU staff is promoting program awareness
    - Assist in transportation needs on a case-by-case basis
    - Coordinating PACT within parole districts
- Parole Agent II**
  - Ensure parole units in their respective areas are referring supervised persons to PACT
  - Liaison between DAPO, DRP, and contracted and community-based program(s)
  - Provide the CDCR Form 2255 to supervised persons attending PACT and collect completed forms at the conclusion
  - Notify LIS of any supervised person who fail to attend scheduled PACT



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### PACT Participation

Investing for successful outcomes




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### PACT Locations

- Conference Room at respective parole units
- Day Reporting Centers at respective geographical area
- Other suitable locations within the community (i.e. community centers, churches, etc.)








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### PACT Attendance

- Mandatory attendance for supervised persons newly released
- Any supervised person needing additional resources



Allows participants to engage in community-based programming and opportunities to learn about, contact, and enroll in available community programs



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Provide support, encourage development, foster a positive environment, identify issues early, and implement success strategies
