Councilmember Votes

CCJBH MHTA Stakeholder Funds

Given that the current CCJBH MHTA Stakeholder Contracts are scheduled to end on June 30, 2023, CCJBH staff proposes that Councilmembers vote on the following Request for Proposal concepts for the next three years, to be funded from the annual \$670,000 Mental Health Services Act Funding (MHSF), which is allocated to CCJBH to support “stakeholder advocacy contracts to support mental health outreach and services for the criminal justice-involved populations”:

- a. Three Local-Level Lived Experience Education and Advocacy Contracts
(\$125,833 per contract/year x 3 contracts x 3 years = \$1,132,500 Total MHSF)
- b. One State-Level Lived Experience Education and Advocacy Contract
(\$188,750/year x 1 contract x 2 years = \$377,500 Total MHSF)
- c. One Contract to Implement the PH/PS Data Analysis and Reporting Framework
(\$166,666/year x 3 years = ~\$500,000 Total MHSF)

Three-Year Total for all contracts combined: \$2,010,000

In addition, CCJBH staff will request a Council motion to delegate to the Executive Officer the authority to make any administrative decisions necessary to carry out the state contracting processes for the Requests for Proposals and Service Agreements agreed upon in the above votes.

CCJBH staff will propose that Councilmembers vote to adopt the 2023 Meeting Schedule and Project Plan Priorities that will be presented at the December 9, 2022, meeting.
