

COVID-19 QUICK GUIDE

POPULATION

INSTITUTIONS

VACCINATION

Incarcerated people must be fully vaccinated, or have an approved medical or religious exemption, prior to participating in the in-person and family visiting programs.

Fully-vaccinated is defined as being 14 days past the last injection of a series.

TESTING

Testing will continue for incarcerated who are identified as close contacts of active cases, as described in the [Movement Matrix](#), as part of the in-person visiting program, and prior to dental encounters.

In-Person Visiting: Vaccinated incarcerated persons will not be required to submit to a PCR test prior to their visit, however they will be required if deemed necessary by health care following the visit.

MASKING

All residents will be provided a minimum of two disposable procedure masks per week to replace cloth masks previously distributed. All residents will also be offered one unaltered KN95 respirator per week, which they can choose to wear for advanced protection.

In-Person Visiting: All vaccinated incarcerated persons will be given a procedure mask. All unvaccinated incarcerated persons with a medical or religious exemption will be given a **KN95 mask** unless fit-tested for an N95 and working in an isolation or quarantine area.

QUARANTINE

Quarantine

Residents in post-transfer quarantine or quarantine due to exposure to COVID-19 may be released after 10 days if the patient has a negative test result on day 10 **and** documentation of no symptoms.

Isolation

Isolation screening will be conducted once daily by licensed health care staff. Patients in isolation may be released after 10 days if a provider has determined it is safe to do so.

Those who do not comply with masking rules during visits may have their visit terminated.

ALL RESIDENTS OF CDCR CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS SHOULD COMPLETE A DAILY SELF-SCREENING FOR COVID-19 SYMPTOMS AND EXPOSURES.
