NOTICE OF CHANGE TO TEXT AS ORIGINALLY PROPOSED

Pursuant to the provisions of Government Code Section 11346.8(c) and Section 44 of Title 1 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR or the department) hereby provides notice of proposed changes made to CCR Sections regarding Hunger Strike. The department proposes to amend sections 3298 and 3298.2, and CDCR Form 128-HS within the CCR, Title 15, Division 3, Chapter 1. You are receiving this notice because you provided a comment regarding these proposed regulations.

Notice of Change to Regulations 24-01 was noticed to the public on January 26, 2024. The full text of the originally proposed amendments is shown in its original single <u>underline</u> and <u>strikethrough</u> format. The changes provided in this Notice of Change to Text as Originally Proposed are indicated by <u>bold double underline</u> for additional added text, and <u>bold double strikethrough</u> for additional deleted text to the originally proposed text. Additionally, CDCR Form 128-HS is revised as described below. Only those comments relating directly to the amendments indicated by <u>bold double underline</u> or <u>bold double strikethrough</u>, or as described below for the CDCR Form 128-HS, will be considered.

In the attached text:

Section 3298 is renumbered to add "(a)" to the first paragraph, which resulted in a renumbering of subsequent subsections in this section.

Subsection 3298(a), the word "section" was replaced with "article" to clarify that the definitions apply to Article 3.5, not just the section.

Subsection 3298(a)(1), "or fluids" was removed from the definition of a hunger strike to clarify that refusing fluids would not be considered a hunger strike.

Subsection 3298.2 is renumbered to add "(a)" to be consistent with other numbering within Title 15.

Revisions to CDCR Form 128-HS, Initial Hunger Strike Chrono:

After further review, the department determined that an additional revision to the CDCR Form 128-HS was necessary for clarity and corrective purposes. CDCR Form 128-HS instruction number "3" on page 1, which read "Refer the incarcerated person for an urgent Mental Health referral," is revised to "Refer the incarcerated person for a Mental Health Assessment to be completed within 72 hours of referral." This revision is necessary to clarify the time frame for completion of the Mental Health Assessment.

Additionally, this revision aligns with existing regulations in CCR Title 15, Division 3, Chapter 2, subsection 3999.427(c)(3)(B), which states that when custody staff identifies that an incarcerated person is a hunger strike participant, "Within 72 hours, mental health staff shall conduct a mental health evaluation for patients in the Mental Health Services Delivery System (MHSDS) or Developmental Disability Program (DDP)."

Subchapter 4. General Institution Regulations.

New Article 3.5 is adopted to read:

Article 3.5. Hunger Strike

New section 3298 is adopted to read:

3298. Definitions.

- (a) The following terms are defined for the purposes of this section article:
- (<u>a1</u>) Hunger Strike is a method of non-violent resistance or pressure in which an incarcerated person refuses to consume food or fluids with the objective of achieving a specific goal.
- (<u>b2</u>) Hunger Strike Participant is an incarcerated person who has refused nine consecutive meals, either individually or as part of a mass hunger strike, with the objective of achieving a specific goal.
- (<u>e3</u>) Initiation of Hunger Strike is the day the incarcerated person has refused their ninth consecutive meal.
- (44) Mass Hunger Strike is three or more hunger strike participants assigned to an area united with a common goal or set of demands disrupting institution operations and requiring statewide or institutional mobilization.

New section 3298.1 is adopted to read:

3298.1. Individual Hunger Strike.

- (a) When a staff member becomes aware of an incarcerated person who has refused nine consecutive meals, they shall immediately notify the respective facility or unit Sergeant or Lieutenant where the hunger strike participant is housed.
- (b) The same day, the facility or unit Sergeant or Lieutenant shall interview the hunger strike participant, shall make every effort to resolve the hunger strike, and shall document initial hunger strike information on CDCR Form 128-HS (12/23), Initial Hunger Strike Chrono, which is incorporated by reference.

New section 3298.2 is adopted to read:

3298.2. Mass Hunger Strike.

(a) During a mass hunger strike, institutions shall follow the procedure detailed in section 3298.1 for each individual hunger strike participant.
