INSTITUTION POSTING AND CERTIFICATION REQUIRED

This Notice announces the proposed amendment of Section 3043.3 in the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Crime Prevention and Corrections, Division 3, regarding the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS).

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The public comment period will close on **October 30, 2024**. Any person may submit written comments about the proposed regulations by mail to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), Regulation and Policy Management Branch (RPMB), P.O. Box 942883, Sacramento, CA 94283-0001, or by e-mail to RPMB@cdcr.ca.gov. All written comments must be received or postmarked no later than **October 30, 2024**.

PUBLIC HEARING INFORMATION

A public hearing regarding these proposed regulations will be held on **October 30, 2024**, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. in Bldg. G-1, Rm. 113, located at 9272 Laguna Springs Dr., Elk Grove, CA 95758. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments about these proposed regulations. It is not a forum to debate the proposed regulations. No decision regarding the permanent adoption of these regulations will be rendered at this hearing. Written comments submitted during the prescribed comment period are given the same significance and weight as oral comments presented at the hearing. This hearing site is accessible to the mobility impaired.

POSTING

This Notice shall be posted immediately upon receipt at locations accessible to incarcerated persons, supervised persons, and employees in each department facility and field office not later than five calendar days after receipt. Also, institutions and facilities shall make this Notice available for review by incarcerated persons in segregated housing who do not have access to the posted copies and shall distribute it to law libraries and advisory councils. CDCR Form 621-A (Rev. 05/19), Certification of Posting, shall be returned to RPMB by mail or email. See Department Operations Manual Section 12010.6.7 for posting and certification of posting procedures.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR or department), proposes to amend Section 3043.3 in Title 15, Division 3, regarding the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS).

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The public comment period begins on **September 13, 2024**, and closes on **October 30, 2024**. AUTHORITY AND REFERENCE

Government Code Section 12838.5 provides that commencing July 1, 2005, CDCR succeeds to, and is vested with, all the powers, functions, duties, responsibilities, obligations, liabilities, and jurisdiction of abolished predecessor entities, such as Department of Corrections, Department of the Youth Authority, and Board of Corrections.

Penal Code (PC) Section 5000 provides that commencing July 1, 2005, any reference to Department of Corrections in this or any code, refers to the CDCR, Division of Adult Operations. **PC Section 5050** provides that commencing July 1, 2005, any reference to the Director of Corrections in this or any other code, refers to the Secretary of the CDCR. As of that date, the office of the Director of Corrections is abolished.

PC Section 5054 provides that commencing July 1, 2005, the supervision, management, and control of the State prisons, and the responsibility for the care, custody, treatment, training, discipline, and employment of persons confined therein are vested in the Secretary of the CDCR. **PC Section 5055** provides that commencing July 1, 2005, all powers and duties previously granted to and imposed upon the Department of Corrections shall be exercised by the Secretary of the CDCR. **PC Section 5058** authorizes the Director to prescribe and amend rules and regulations for the administration of prisons and for the administration of the parole of persons. **PC Section 5058.3** authorizes the Director to certify in a written statement filed with Office of Administrative Law that operational needs of the department require adoption, amendment, or repeal of regulation on an emergency basis.

INFORMATIVE DIGEST / POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

The proposed regulations expand program offerings to provide incarcerated individuals with work and skill development opportunities, aligning with the department's goal of facilitating the successful reintegration of these individuals into society. New Milestone Completion Credit (MCC) courses are added, and some courses are removed due to the closure of the Division of Juvenile Justice, or due to their components being integrated into other courses. Some MCC courses are adjusted to achieve balance among programs with consideration to the academic rigor necessary for successful course completion. Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses are added, and align with Penal Code 2053.5, which provides that programs meet specific criteria to ensure the successful employment of incarcerated persons upon their release back into society. Additionally, the proposed regulations rectify problems with the Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (CBI) program, which did not allow hours to be transferred from different CBI programs to receive credit toward the 80-hour requirement for the MCC. CBI participants may now receive credit in any of the CBI programs towards the 80-hour requirement. The CBI program also now includes a CBI Aftercare program to help mitigate the potential relapse of CBI participants and provide continued support for CBI participants in active recovery.

This action will:

- Expand program offerings, adding new MCC courses to the MCCS to provide additional work and skill development opportunities for incarcerated individuals.
- Add Career Technical Education (CTE) courses, which align with Penal Code 2053.5.
- Adjust some MCC course values to achieve balance among programs with consideration to the academic rigor necessary for successful course completion.
- Provide for Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (CBI) program hours to be transferred between different CBI programs to allow for participants to receive credit in any CBI program and receive credit toward the 80-hour requirement.
- Remove some MCC courses due to their components being integrated into other courses; and with the closure of the Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), remove those DJJ related milestone descriptions and codes.
- Provide for a new CBI Aftercare Program, to help mitigate the potential relapse of CBI participants and provide continued support for CBI participants.
- Align MCC course titles with industry partners, including the United States Department of Labor, Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.
- Add two new courses to MCC Schedule 3, California Prison Industry Authority.
- Incorporate by reference, into Title 15, Division 3, the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS) (REV. 05/24).

DOCUMENTS INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE

SPECIFIC BENEFITS ANTICIPATED BY THE PROPOSED REGULATIONS

These regulations will provide eligible incarcerated individuals greater opportunity to participate in programs and to earn MCC. In addition, newly added and enhanced rehabilitative programs will provide incarcerated individuals with productive and relevant work and skill development opportunities to better prepare them to find employment upon release, and thereby reduce recidivism. The changes to MCC courses align with industry standards and promote CDCR's mission to facilitate the successful reintegration of individuals back to their communities equipped with the tools to be drug-free, healthy, and employable members of society by providing education, treatment, rehabilitative, and restorative justice programs. Additionally, the CBI Aftercare program will help to mitigate the potential relapse of CBI participants and provide continued support for CBI participants in active recovery.

EVALUATION OF INCONSISTENCY/INCOMPATIBILITY WITH EXISTING LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Pursuant to Government Code 11346.5(a)(3)(D), the department has determined the proposed regulations are not inconsistent or incompatible with existing regulations. After conducting a review for any regulations that would relate to or affect this area, the department has concluded that these are the only regulations that concern Milestone Completion Credits.

LOCAL MANDATES

This action imposes no mandates on local agencies or school districts, or a mandate which requires reimbursement of costs or savings pursuant to Government Code Sections 17500 - 17630.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

- Cost to any local agency or school district that is required to be reimbursed: *None*
- Cost or savings to any state agency: *savings to state government (CDCR), related to Early Release, as follows:*
\$29,000 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-26, \$86,000 in FY 2026-27, \$191,000 in FY 2027-28, and \$279,000 in FY 2028-29.

\$14,000 in FY 2025-26, \$27,000 in FY 2026-27, \$27,000 in FY 2027-28, and \$55,000 in FY 2028-29.

EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS

The department has made an initial determination that the proposed action will have no significant effect on housing costs.

COST IMPACTS ON REPRESENTATIVE PRIVATE PERSONS OR BUSINESSES

The department is not aware of any cost impacts that a representative private person or business would necessarily incur in reasonable compliance with the proposed action.

SIGNIFICANT STATEWIDE ADVERSE ECONOMIC IMPACT ON BUSINESS

The department has made an initial determination that the proposed regulations will not have a significant statewide adverse economic impact directly affecting business, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states, because the proposed regulations place no obligations or requirements on any business.

EFFECT ON SMALL BUSINESSES

The department has determined that the proposed regulations will not affect small businesses. This action has no significant adverse economic impact on small business because they place no obligations or requirements on any business.

RESULTS OF THE ECONOMIC IMPACT ASSESSMENT

The department has determined that the proposed regulation will have no effect on the creation of new, or the elimination of existing, jobs or businesses within California, or effect the expansion of businesses currently doing business in California. The department has determined that the proposed regulation will have no effect on the state's environment or worker safety. The proposed regulations will benefit the health and welfare of California residents by increasing public safety due to better reintegration and reduced recidivism of incarcerated persons upon their release into their communities.

CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES

The department must determine that no reasonable alternative considered by the department or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the department would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the action is proposed, would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed regulatory action, or would be more cost-effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provisions of law. Interested

persons are invited to present statements or arguments with respect to any alternatives to the changes proposed at the scheduled hearing or during the written comment period.

AVAILABILITY OF PROPOSED TEXT AND INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

The department has prepared and will make available the text and the Initial Statement of Reasons (ISOR) of the proposed regulations. The rulemaking file for this regulatory action, which contains those items and all information on which the proposal is based (i.e., rulemaking file) is available to the public upon request directed to the department's contact person. The proposed text, ISOR, and Notice of Proposed Regulations will also be made available on the department's website: www.cdcr.ca.gov.

AVAILABILITY OF THE FINAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

Following its preparation, a copy of the Final Statement of Reasons may be obtained from the department's contact person.

AVAILABILITY OF CHANGES TO PROPOSED TEXT

After considering all timely and relevant comments received, the department may adopt the proposed regulations substantially as described in this Notice. If the department makes modifications which are sufficiently related to the originally proposed text, it will make the modified text, with the changes clearly indicated, available to the public for at least 15 days before the department adopts, amends, or repeals the regulations as revised. Requests for copies of any modified regulation text should be directed to the contact person indicated in this Notice. The department will accept written comments on the modified regulations for at least 15 days after the date on which they are made available.

Article 3.3. Credits

3043.3. Milestone Completion Credit

[Subsections 3043.3(a) through 3043.3(c) are unchanged.]

[Subsection 3043.3(d) is amended to read:]

(d) A Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (REV. ~~40/22~~ 05/24) is hereby incorporated by reference. The schedule identifies all of the approved Milestone Completion Credit programs, the corresponding credit reduction for successful completion of each program, and whether credit for repeating the program is authorized. The department may authorize a program be repeated for credit if there are significant rehabilitative benefits to be gained by those incarcerated persons who retake the program.

INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR or the department), proposes to amend section 3043.3(d), of the California Code of Regulations, Title 15, Division 3, Chapter 1, Article 3.3, regarding Milestone Completion Credit (MCC). The proposed regulations revise the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS), which is incorporated by reference in subsection 3043.3(d).

BACKGROUND

In 2009, new legislation amended PC section 2933 and created new PC section 2933.05. This law directly affected an incarcerated person's credit earning and eligibility status. PC section 2933.05 allowed the department to award eligible incarcerated people milestone completion credits for completion of approved rehabilitative program performance milestones to reduce their terms of confinement. In 2010, CDCR adopted regulations to comply with this legislation. The MCCS was created to establish specific programs and credit allotments available to incarcerated people. Each program is divided into milestones (components), for which credit will be awarded.

The Public Safety and Rehabilitation Act of 2016 (Proposition 57) was approved by California voters in 2016. This proposition amended the California Constitution to establish that CDCR shall have authority to award credits earned for approved rehabilitative or educational achievements.

CDCR is expanding its program offerings to provide incarcerated individuals with work and skill development opportunities, aligning with the department's goal of facilitating the successful reintegration of these individuals into society. New MCC courses include Audio Video Production, Computer and Related Technologies, Laborer, Micro-Homes Advanced Construction, Youth Offender Mentoring Program, an Employment Transitions eLearning course, Barbering, and a new Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (CBI) Aftercare program. Additionally, a Certificate of Attendance and Participation course is added for students in the Developmental Disability Program who have not made educationally expected progress on formative, summative, and standardized educational assessments for enrolled courses, and are unable to earn a diploma. Some MCC courses are removed due to their components being integrated into other courses; and with the closure of the Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), those DJJ related milestone descriptions and codes have been eliminated. The proposed regulations adjust some current MCC course values to achieve balance among programs with consideration to the academic rigor necessary for successful course completion.

Courses added to the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Milestone Descriptions and Codes align with California Penal Code (PC) section 2053.5. Consistent with PC section 2053.5, and the goals and priorities of the department, CTE programs consider the following factors: a) Whether the program aligns with the workforce needs of high-demand sectors of the state and regional economies; (b) Whether there is an active job market for the skills being developed where the incarcerated person will likely be released; (c) Whether the program increases the number of incarcerated persons who obtain a marketable and industry or apprenticeship board-recognized certification, credential, or degree; (d) Whether there are formal or informal networks in the field that support finding employment upon release from prison; and (e) Whether the program will

lead to employment in occupations with a livable wage. Various programs have either increased or decreased the amount of credit that an incarcerated person can earn based on coursework, in-class participation requirements, and length of program to gain a mastery of understanding for completion. The longer duration a program takes on average to complete, the more MCC weeks will be awarded.

The Integrated Substance Use Disorder Treatment (ISUDT) program models currently include the following Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (CBI) programs: CBI-Intensive Outpatient (ISI), CBI-Outpatient (ISO), and CBI-Life Skills (CB2). Presently, participants receive MCC for 80 hours in each program, but these hours cannot be transferred between different CBI programs. This results in participants engaging in multiple hours of different CBI programs without receiving credit towards the 80-hour requirement. The intent of these proposed regulations is to credit participation in any CBI program within the ISUDT program model towards the 80-hour requirement for MCC. This will help to incentivize incarcerated persons' completion of CBI programs. Additionally, proposed revisions to the ISUDT CBI program add CBI Aftercare to the included CBI programs. The ISUDT CBI Aftercare program is intended to help prevent relapse of participants who have completed CBI programs. The CBI Aftercare program will help to mitigate the potential relapse of CBI participants and provide continued support for CBI participants in active recovery.

Currently, MCC course titles are not aligned with industry partners, including the United States (US) Department of Labor, Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). These proposed regulations change MCC course titles to be consistent with naming conventions and industry standards. In Adult Basic Education, titles are adjusted to align with test ranges set by the US Department of Labor under the WIOA. Additionally, these proposed regulations add prefixes to CTE course titles to include the course type instead of only the course level to better differentiate MCCs between the CTE programs.

New MCC courses are added to MCC Schedule 3, under Career Technical Education (CTE) Computer Coding, which include two (2) new Audio Video Program (AVP) courses. The California Prison Industry Authority (CALPIA) is modifying current program offerings to expand to other common professions requiring a background in and knowledge of computer software, specifically in audio and video engineering. The new AVP courses will create more opportunities for incarcerated students interested in a career in technology beyond computer coding. These courses are a significant step towards aligning education with real-world job markets, providing incarcerated students the tools needed to be well-prepared for competitive employment upon their release. These new courses are significant to CALPIA's mission of providing productive work and skill development opportunities to incarcerated individuals to reduce recidivism, increase public safety and institution safety.

CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES

The department must determine that no other reasonable alternatives considered, or otherwise identified and brought to the attention of the department, would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which this action is proposed, would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the action proposed, or would be more cost-effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provision of law. Currently, no alternatives have

been brought to the attention of the department that would alter the department's initial determination.

ECONOMIC IMPACT ASSESSMENT

The 2022-23 budget included funding for the CDCR and California Correctional Health Care Services (CCHCS) expansion of the ISUDT program, and enhancements to the program that include implementing a CBI Aftercare program to prevent relapse for participants who complete cognitive behavioral interventions for substance use disorder. Additionally, the 2021-22 budget included funding specifically for the Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP) to implement a Micro Home Advanced Contracting (MHAC) program, and a Media training center at Valley State Prison.

The revised MCCA amends and adopts programs that are eligible to earn MCC and amends the amount of credit granted upon completion of specified programs, which has an impact on the average daily population for incarcerated persons, supervised persons, and individuals under Post Release Community Supervision. The fiscal impact on state government includes savings for CDCR of approximately \$29,000 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-26, \$86,000 in FY 2026-27, \$191,000 in FY 2027-28, and \$279,000 in FY 2028-29. The fiscal impact on local government for County Probation (Post Release Community Supervision) include costs of \$14,000 in FY 2025-26, \$27,000 in FY 2026-27, \$27,000 in FY 2027-28, and \$55,000 in FY 2028-29.

In accordance with Government Code section 11346.3, subdivision (b), CDCR has made the following assessments regarding the proposed regulations:

Creation of New or the Elimination of Existing Jobs within the State of California

The expansion of ISUDT CBI programs will create additional jobs within the state of California. DRP amended existing vendor contracts to provide CBI Aftercare programs within the department. The 2022-2023 ISUDT Budget Change Proposal, which was approved and funded, includes ongoing funding for several Alcohol and Other Drug counselors throughout the state.

Creation of New, Expansion, or Elimination of Existing Businesses Currently Doing Business within the State of California

The department has determined that the proposed regulations will not have an impact on the creation of new, expansion, or elimination of existing businesses currently doing business in California, as the proposed regulations affect the internal management of California prisons only.

Benefits to the Health and Welfare of California Residents, Worker Safety, and the State's Environment

The proposed regulations will benefit the health and welfare of California residents by increasing public safety due to better reintegration and reduced recidivism of incarcerated persons upon their release into their communities. The proposed regulations will have no impact on worker safety or the state's environment.

Significant Adverse Economic Impact on Businesses

The department has made an initial determination the proposed regulations will not have a significant adverse economic impact on business. Additionally, there has been no testimony or other evidence provided that would alter the department's initial determination. The proposed regulations affect the internal management of CDCR only and place no requirements or restrictions on businesses.

BENEFITS OF THE REGULATIONS

These regulations will provide eligible incarcerated individuals greater opportunity to participate in programs and to earn MCC. In addition, newly added and enhanced rehabilitative programs will provide incarcerated individuals with productive and relevant work and skill development opportunities to better prepare them to find employment upon release, and thereby reduce recidivism. The changes to MCC courses align with industry standards and promote CDCR's mission to facilitate the successful reintegration of individuals back to their communities equipped with the tools to be drug-free, healthy, and employable members of society by providing education, treatment, rehabilitative, and restorative justice programs. Additionally, the CBI Aftercare program will help to mitigate the potential relapse of CBI participants and provide continued support for CBI participants in active recovery.

DOCUMENTS RELIED UPON

CALPIA, in proposing additions to MCCS 3, relied upon the UC Irvine study titled – The Effect of Prison Industry on Recidivism, which concluded after a multi-year study that CTE participants are significantly less likely to reoffend.

[The Effect of Prison Industry on Recidivism](#)

CALPIA CTE programs have a return to custody recidivism rate of 9.5%. Additionally, the study showed three years after release from being incarcerated, 15.4% of CALPIA participants returned to custody compared to 22% of those on a waitlist to get into CALPIA programs.

SPECIFIC PURPOSE AND RATIONALE FOR EACH SECTION, PER GOVERNMENT CODE 11346.2(b)(1)

Subsection 3043.3(d) is amended to reflect the new revision date of 05/24 for the MCCS, which is incorporated by reference. The revisions are necessary to add, delete, and amend a variety of programs and courses available for eligible incarcerated individuals to earn milestone completions and credits. Further explanation of the revisions to the MCCS are detailed below.

MILESTONE COMPLETION CREDIT SCHEDULE (MCCS)

The MCCS, which is incorporated by reference in section 3043.3, is comprised of four schedules. Although the schedules are numbered 1 through 5, Schedule 4, which was previously for the Contract Bed Unit (CBU), was deleted in the previous rulemaking, as the CBU was eliminated. These regulations modify Schedule 1, Division of Rehabilitative

Programs (DRP), and Schedule 3, California Prison Industry Authority (CALPIA). Titles of courses and SOMS codes are updated throughout the MCCS to reflect new and updated courses. Only minor modifications are made to Schedule 2, Division of Adult Institutions (DAI), and Schedule 5, Health Care Related Programs (HCRP). These minor modifications include non-substantive changes to align with OAL matter 2024-0521-02N, effective 7/1/24, which updated the terms “inmate(s)” to “incarcerated person(s).” For Schedule 2, the program heading “Inmate Ward Labor” is revised to “Incarcerated Person Labor” due to the closure of DJJ the department no longer has wards in the program, however the program remains the same and is unchanged. The revision date of the MCCS is updated from “10/22” to “05/24.” A copy of the MCCS is incorporated by reference in this rulemaking.

MCC Schedule 1 - Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP)

Academic Milestones

Adult Basic Education (ABE) I and II, and Adult Secondary Education (ASE)

Students are assessed through the Comprehensive Adult Student Assessment System (CASAS). CASAS is the federally mandated accountability assessment for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) federal grant. The National Reporting System (NRS) reviews and approves assessments for federal accountability reporting. Assessments are approved by the NRS for a limited time.

As part of the NRS approval process, statistical analysis is conducted to determine scale score ranges for each Educational Functioning Level. Thus, the new CASAS Greater Opportunities for Adult Learning Success (GOALS) series introduces new scale score ranges for each level. The new test ranges in the MCCS have been updated to align with these new scale score ranges as determined by the NRS.

Developmental Disability Program (DDP)

DRP’s Office of Correctional Education has added a Certificate of Attendance and Participation (CAP) for students in the Developmental Disability Program (DDP). The CAP provides an opportunity for these students in the DDP to satisfactorily complete a high school alternative course of study and earn MCCs.

Career Technical Education Milestones

Audio Video Production (AVP)

Courses are added to allow MCC to be earned.

Auto Body

Course titles are renamed, I-CAR courses are renamed and replaced with certification courses, and a course is added for Auto Body Certification – Level 2.

Automotive Technician

Course header is amended from Auto Mechanics to Automotive Technician, consistent with industry standards. All course types and titles are amended to be consistent with the course header title, and for consistency with industry standards. The “Basic Auto” (renamed Auto Tech Training – Basic) course value is decreased from 3 weeks to 2 weeks, and the Level 1, 2, and 3 course values have increased from 3 to 4 weeks.

Programs have either increased or decreased the amount of credit that an incarcerated person can earn based on coursework, in-class participation requirements, and length in program to gain a mastery of understanding for completion. The longer duration a program takes on average to complete, the more MCC weeks will be awarded.

Barbering

Courses are added to allow MCC to be earned.

Building Maintenance

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Computer Aided Design and Manufacturing (CAD/CAM)

Courses are placed under Computer and Related Technology (CRT) courses to consolidate digital literacy programs in one section of the MCCS.

Career Core

Course titles are amended. OSHA and forklift certification courses are removed as these certifications are integrated components of the Career Core certification.

Carpentry

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Computer and Related Technologies (CRT)

Course header is amended from Computer and Related Technology to Computer and Related Technologies for a more appropriate title, and the acronym (CRT) is added. Course titles are renamed, and courses are added to allow MCC to be earned.

Coding

Course types and titles are amended.

Cosmetology

Courses are removed and added to simplify the curriculum and achieve course objectives. The Cosmetology License Award course is renamed.

Electronics

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Electrical

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Heating Ventilation & Air Conditioning (HVAC)

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Laborer

Courses are added to allow MCC to be earned.

Manufacturing Design and Engineering (MDE: Machine Shop)

Course header is amended from Manufacturing Engineering and Design Practices (Machine Shop) to Manufacturing Design and Engineering (MDE: Machine Shop), for a more appropriate title. Courses are removed and added to simplify the curriculum and achieve course objectives. Course type is amended from Machine Shop to MDE. Level I, II, III, and IV Certification course titles are renamed to MDE Certification Level 1 through 4. Students have the technical understanding and skills with the tools of the trade to meet industry standards after completing Level 4, therefore, Level V Certification is removed to optimize programming and cost efficiency.

Masonry

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Micro Homes Advanced Construction (MHAC)

Courses are added to allow MCC to be earned.

Painting

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Plumbing

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor. Students have the technical understanding and skills with the tools of the trade to meet industry standards after completing Level 2, therefore, Level 3 course for Plumbing is removed to optimize programming and cost efficiency.

Sheet Metal

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Welding

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Roofing

Course titles are amended. NCCER is removed from the course title so that the course is not tied to a specific vendor.

Adult Continuing Education Milestones

eLearning

Employment – Transitions – eLearning course is added to allow MCC to be earned.

Youth Offender Program (YOP) Mentor Training

Courses are added to allow MCC to be earned.

General Milestones

Male Community Reentry Program (MCRP)/Female Community Reentry Program (FCRP)/Community Participant Mother Program (CPMP)

Course header is amended to reflect new titles of course programs. New acronyms are provided for the course type, consistent with the new course program titles.

Integrated Substance Use Disorder Treatment (ISUDT) Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (CBI) Programs

Existing CBI courses including CBI-ISI, CBI-ISO, CB2, and the new CBI-Aftercare are combined to allow MCC to be earned based on up to 80 hours of participation in one or a combination of CBI courses. The current model for CBI ISI is 20 hours of participation and completion credits no longer apply, therefore, CBI-ISI - Completion is removed from the MCCS. The Aftercare program is added to help reduce relapse among CBI participants.

Occupational Mentor Certification Program (OMCP)/Recruit

Program header is amended from Offender Mentor Certification Program (OMCP) / Recruit to Occupational Mentor Certification Program (OMCP) / Recruit due to the change in the program's name. Course type, and course titles are renamed to reflect the change in the program name.

Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) Milestones

The Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) program courses are removed due to the closure of the Division of Juvenile Justice.

Legend

The acronym for CCTRP is updated to FCRP, under the *R4 code, due to the change to the program name.

The word "inmates" under the *R7 code is changed to "incarcerated persons" for consistency with newly adopted regulations which changed terminology that was determined to have derogatory or outdated connotations.

*R8 is added to the existing legend denoting that credits will be awarded for every eighty (80) hours participated in any combination of the following CBI programs, ISI, ISO, CB2, and Aftercare.
