NOTICE OF CHANGE TO REGULATIONS

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INSTITUTION POSTING AND CERTIFICATION REQUIRED

This Notice announces the proposed amendment of section 3043.3 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Crime Prevention and Corrections, Division 3, Chapter 1, regarding the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The public comment period will close on **October 20, 2026**. Any person may submit written comments about the proposed regulations by mail to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), Regulation and Policy Management Branch (RPMB), P.O. Box 942883, Sacramento, CA 94283-0001, or by e-mail to RPMB@cdcr.ca.gov. All written comments must be received or postmarked no later than **October 20, 2026**.

PUBLIC HEARING INFORMATION

A public hearing regarding these proposed regulations will be held **October 20, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. in Room C-105, located at 8260 Longleaf Dr., Building C, Elk Grove CA**. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments about the proposed regulations. It is not a forum to debate the proposed regulations. No decision regarding the permanent adoption of these regulations will be rendered at this hearing. Written comments submitted during the prescribed comment period are given the same significance and weight as oral comments presented at the hearing. This hearing site is accessible to the mobility impaired.

POSTING

This Notice shall be posted immediately upon receipt at locations accessible to incarcerated or supervised persons, and employees in each Department facility and field office not later than five calendar days after receipt. Also, institutions and facilities shall make this Notice available for review by incarcerated persons in restricted housing who do not have access to the posted copies, and shall distribute it to incarcerated person law libraries and advisory councils. CDCR Form 621-A (Rev. 05/19), Certification of Posting, shall be returned to RPMB by mail or email. See Department Operations Manual Section 12010.6.7 for posting and certification of posting procedures.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR or the department), proposes to amend section 3043.3 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Division 3, Chapter 1, regarding the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The public comment period begins **September 4, 2026** and closes on **October 20, 2026**. AUTHORITY AND REFERENCE

Government Code Section 12838.5 provides that commencing July 1, 2005, CDCR succeeds to, and is vested with, all the powers, functions, duties, responsibilities, obligations, liabilities, and jurisdiction of abolished predecessor entities, such as Department of Corrections, Department of the Youth Authority, and Board of Corrections.

PC Section 5054 provides that commencing July 1, 2005, the supervision, management, and control of the State prisons, and the responsibility for the care, custody, treatment, training, discipline, and employment of persons confined therein are vested in the Secretary of the CDCR.

PC Section 5058 authorizes the Director to prescribe and amend rules and regulations for the administration of prisons and for the administration of the parole of persons.

Additional provisions of law cited in the amended CCR sections: Cal. Const., article I, Section 32(b); and Sections 5054 and 5058, Penal Code. Cal. Const., article I, Section 32(a)(2); and Section 2933.05, Penal Code.

INFORMATIVE DIGEST / POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

In 2009, legislation amended Penal Code (PC) section 2933 and created new PC section 2933.05. PC section 2933.05 allowed the department to award eligible incarcerated persons Milestone Completion Credits (MCC) for completion of approved rehabilitative programs to reduce their terms of confinement. In 2010, the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS) was created to establish specific programs and credit allotments available to incarcerated persons. Each program is divided into milestones (components), for which credit will be awarded.

The Public Safety and Rehabilitation Act (Proposition 57) was approved by California voters in 2016. This proposition amended the California Constitution to establish that CDCR shall have authority to award credits earned for approved rehabilitative or educational achievements.

This action will:

- Update the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule to account for various additions, revisions, and deletions to the rehabilitative, educational, and other programs available to incarcerated persons and the amount of credit that may be earned upon successful completion.

DOCUMENTS INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE

Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (Rev. 01/27)

Justification for incorporating forms by reference: the department uses over 1,500 forms, many of which are regulatory. It would be unduly cumbersome, expensive and impractical to print all these forms in the CCR text, therefore the department has always incorporated forms by reference, except in specific circumstances which do not apply in the case of these regulations.

The adopted, amended, and/or repealed forms included in this rulemaking action are available to the public for review and are included in the notice of rulemaking sent to all parties who have requested notification

SPECIFIC BENEFITS ANTICIPATED BY THE PROPOSED REGULATIONS

The department anticipates that these regulations will help to reduce recidivism and, eventually, prison overcrowding, by providing rehabilitation and vocational skills, thus helping to better prepare incarcerated persons to find employment upon their release from California prisons.

EVALUATION OF INCONSISTENCY/INCOMPATIBILITY WITH EXISTING REGULATIONS

Pursuant to Government Code 11346.5(a)(3)(D), the department has determined the proposed regulations are not inconsistent or incompatible with existing regulations. After conducting a review for any regulations that would relate to or affect this area, the department has concluded that these are the only regulations that concern Milestone Completion Credits.

LOCAL MANDATES

This action imposes no mandates on local agencies or school districts, or a mandate, which requires reimbursement of costs or savings pursuant to Government Code Sections 17500 - 17630.

EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS

The department has made an initial determination that the proposed action will have no significant effect on housing costs.

COST IMPACTS ON REPRESENTATIVE PRIVATE PERSONS OR BUSINESSES

The department is not aware of any cost impacts that a representative private person or business would necessarily incur in reasonable compliance with the proposed action.

SIGNIFICANT STATEWIDE ADVERSE ECONOMIC IMPACT ON BUSINESS

The department has made an initial determination that this action will not have a significant statewide adverse economic impact on business, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states because the proposed regulations affect the internal management of CDCR only, and place no requirements or restrictions on businesses.

EFFECT ON SMALL BUSINESSES

The department has determined that the proposed regulations will not affect small businesses. This action has no significant adverse economic impact on small businesses because they place no obligations or requirements on any business.

RESULTS OF THE ECONOMIC IMPACT ASSESSMENT

The department has determined that the proposed regulation will not have any impact on the following:

- Creation or elimination of jobs within California.
- Creation of new businesses or elimination of existing businesses within California.
- Expansion of businesses currently doing business with the state.
- The state's environment.
- Worker safety.

The department has determined that the proposed regulations do not impact the health and welfare of California residents. However, the regulations may benefit incarcerated persons by improving their employment opportunities upon release from prison to the community.

CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES

The department must determine that no reasonable alternative considered by the department or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the department would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the action is proposed, would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed regulatory action, or would be more cost-effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provisions of law. Interested persons are invited to present statements or arguments with

respect to any alternatives to the changes proposed at the scheduled hearing or during the written comment period.

AVAILABILITY OF PROPOSED TEXT AND INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

The department has prepared and will make available the text and the Initial Statement of Reasons (ISOR) of the proposed regulations. The rulemaking file for this regulatory action, which contains those items and all information on which the proposal is based (i.e., rulemaking file) is available to the public upon request directed to the department's contact person. The proposed text, ISOR, and Notice of Proposed Regulations will also be made available on the department's website: www.cdcr.ca.gov.

AVAILABILITY OF THE FINAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

Following its preparation, a copy of the Final Statement of Reasons may be obtained from the department's contact person.

AVAILABILITY OF CHANGES TO PROPOSED TEXT

After considering all timely and relevant comments received, the department may adopt the proposed regulations substantially as described in this Notice. If the department makes modifications which are sufficiently related to the originally proposed text, it will make the modified text, with the changes clearly indicated, available to the public for at least 15 days before the department adopts, amends or repeals the regulations as revised. Requests for copies of any modified regulation text should be directed to the contact person indicated in this Notice. The department will accept written comments on the modified regulations for at least 15 days after the date on which they are made available.

Title 15. Crime Prevention and Corrections

Division 3, Adult Institutions, Programs and Parole

Chapter 1. Rules and Regulations of Adult Operations and Programs

Article 3.3. Credits

3043.3. Milestone Completion Credit

[Subsections 3043.3(a) through 3043.3(c) are unchanged.]

[Subsection 3043.3(d) is amended to read:]

(d) A Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (REV. ~~01/26~~ 01/27) is hereby incorporated by reference. The schedule identifies all of the approved Milestone Completion Credit programs, the corresponding credit reduction for successful completion of each program, and whether credit for repeating the program is authorized. The department may authorize a program be repeated for credit if there are significant rehabilitative benefits to be gained by those incarcerated persons who retake the program.

INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR or the department) proposes to amend the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Division 3, section 3043.3 and the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS), which is incorporated by reference in this section.

In 2009, legislation amended Penal Code (PC) section 2933 and created new PC section 2933.05. PC section 2933.05 allowed the department to award eligible incarcerated persons Milestone Completion Credits (MCC) for completion of approved rehabilitative programs to reduce their terms of confinement. In 2010, the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS) was created to establish specific programs and credit allotments available to incarcerated persons. Each program is divided into milestones (components), for which credit will be awarded.

The Public Safety and Rehabilitation Act (Proposition 57) was approved by California voters in 2016. This proposition amended the California Constitution to establish that CDCR shall have authority to award credits earned for approved rehabilitative or educational achievements.

The department is proposing to revise the MCCS to adopt new MCC courses and delete those related to defunct MCC programs. This will provide eligible incarcerated persons with greater opportunities to participate in rehabilitative, vocational, and programs and to earn MCC upon successful completion. The newly added courses will provide work and skill development opportunities to better prepare incarcerated persons to find employment upon release from prison, and thereby help to reduce recidivism. The department updates this schedule on a roughly annual basis to account for many factors including changes to industry standards and employment trends.

BENEFITS OF THE REGULATIONS

The proposed regulations will provide eligible incarcerated persons with greater opportunities to participate in programs and to earn MCC. By incarcerated persons participating in MCC programs, it will assist with their rehabilitation, future success, and provide them with valuable job skills they can utilize once released from prison. Additionally, participating in credit-earning programs incentivizes individuals to accept and retain jobs during their incarceration. Incarcerated persons will enhance their technical and social skills, instilling them with accountability and responsibility, and preparing them for careers after incarceration.

CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES:

The department must determine that no reasonable alternative is being considered or has been identified that would better serve the proposal's purpose. The department must also ensure that no other approach provides the same level of statutory effectiveness with less burden or lower costs to private persons.

Currently, no reasonable alternatives have been brought to the attention of the department that would alter the department's initial determination.

ECONOMIC IMPACT ASSESSMENT:

In accordance with Government Code Section 11346.3(b), the department has made the following assessments regarding the proposed regulations: This action will not have a significant adverse economic impact directly affecting business, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states, because the proposed regulations place no obligations or requirements on any business.

Significant Adverse Economic Impact on Business

The department has made an initial determination that the proposed regulatory action will not have a significant adverse economic impact on business. Additionally, there have been no facts, evidence, documents, testimony, or other evidence provided that would alter the department's initial determination. The proposed regulations do not have a direct impact on California businesses as the proposed regulations affect the internal management of prisons only.

Creation of New or Elimination of Existing Jobs within the State of California

The department has determined that the proposed regulations will not have an impact on the creation of new or elimination of existing jobs within California as the proposed regulations affect the internal management of prisons only.

Creation of New, Expansion or the Elimination of Existing Businesses Currently Doing Business within the State of California

The department has determined that the proposed regulations will not have an impact on the creation of new or the elimination of existing businesses within California or affect the expansion of businesses currently doing business in California as the proposed regulations affect the internal management of prisons only.

MATERIALS RELIED UPON:

The department, in proposing amendments to these regulations, has not relied upon any technical, theoretical, or empirical study, report, or similar document.

SPECIFIC PURPOSE AND RATIONALE FOR EACH SECTION, PER GOVERNMENT CODE 11346.2(b)(1):

Article 3.3. Credits

3043.3. Milestone Completion Credit.

Subsection 3043.3(d) is amended to establish a new revision date for the Milestone Completion Credit Schedule (MCCS), which is incorporated by reference in this section. The MCCS is comprised of four schedules for different divisions within the department:

Schedule 1 - Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP); Schedule 2 - Division of Adult Institutions (DAI); Schedule 3 - California Prison Industry Authority (CALPIA) (now CALCTRA - see below); and Schedule 5 - Health Care Related Programs (HCRP). These proposed regulations include revisions to Schedule 1 and Schedule 2. Schedule 3 is amended solely to update the title of the responsible program from the California Prison Industry Authority (CalPIA) to the California Correctional Training and Rehabilitation Authority (CALCTRA). This change took place on January 1, 2026, as a result of the enactment of Senate Bill 157 and Senate Bill 857. Schedule 5 is not amended as part of this rulemaking action. Schedule 4 previously belonged to the Contract Bed Unit but was eliminated in a previous rulemaking as the Contract Bed Unit no longer exists.

MILESTONE COMPLETION CREDIT SCHEDULE (MCCS)

MCCS, Schedule 1 – Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP)

The proposed revisions for MCCS, Schedule 1 (DRP), provide for updates as described below:

The Adult Basic Education (ABE)/Adult Secondary Education (ASE) – MCC section is currently divided into sub-sections that distinguish between the individual courses (ABE 1, ABE 2, etc.). This requested change is needed to eliminate the unnecessary sub-headings, which have caused confusion and have the potential to unnecessarily delay an MCC for a student who completes an Educational Function Level and earns a milestone while enrolled in a course different than the one appearing on the MCC Schedule sub-heading.

High School Equivalency (HSE) –The words “GED Only” is unnecessary and therefore deleted.

High School Diploma – Two English courses (4A and 4B) have been added that may be used to fulfill the graduation requirement for CDCR.

College – Course title has been revised. The update clarifies that one MCC is awarded for completion of one college course, worth a minimum of 3 semester or 4 quarter units. Completion of a course worth more than 3 semester or 4 quarter units earns only one MCC. Completion of a course worth less than 3 semester units or 4 quarter units does not earn MCC. In addition, the update clarifies that a student must be matriculated in the college or university to earn education MCC. Matriculated means that they have applied for admission to the college, they have been admitted to the college, and they are enrolled in the college.

Peer Literacy Mentor Program – Course titles changed to include Mentor Training and remove Component number to add clarity and consistency with other program documentation.

Auto Body Certification – Basics is being removed as there is no longer an ICAR (Inter-Industry Conference on Auto Collision Repair) certification for basics.

Auto Body – Collision and Painting – course titles changed to identify each level of Training and Certification.

Automotive Technician – EPA Certification was moved from Career Core as it is offered under Auto Tech.

Barbering – Due to the industry partner's reorganization of the Barbering scope and sequence, the reduction in time was adjusted accordingly. Therefore, new MCC codes are required.

Career Core – Job Readiness is being removed because our industry partner has adjusted their curricular scope and sequence, therefore it is no longer required. EPA certification was moved to be placed under the programs in which it is offered.

CRT – Has been removed from the CTE section and 2 courses have been moved to the Adult Continuing Education Milestone section. The program does not meet the requirements in Penal Code section 2053.5.

Cosmetology – Due to the industry partner's reorganization of the Cosmetology scope and sequence, the reduction in time was adjusted accordingly. Therefore, new MCC codes are required.

Electronics – The curriculum for this program has changed as our industry partner has reorganized the curricular scope and sequence for this program. As a result, new SOMS codes are needed to appropriately track this change. The reduction time for Electronic Training Level 1 should be reduced from 3 weeks to 2 weeks and 287 hours to 170 hours. This MCC and Electrical Works Level 1 Training MCC are equivalent. Electronics Certification Level 1 and Electrical Works Certification Level 1 MCC are equivalent. Therefore, new MCC codes are required.

Electrical – The course name has been updated to Electrical Works to align with industry standards.

Electrical Works – The reduction time for Electrical Works Training Level 1 should be reduced from 6 weeks to 2 weeks to be equivalent to Electronics Training Level 1. Wind and Solar components from Level 1 were moved to create Level 3 training and certification. Therefore, new MCC codes are required.

HVAC – EPA Certification moved from Career Core as it is offered under HVAC.

Manufacturing Design and Engineering (MDE) – The current prefix is V15, which is the prefix used for Welding. To avoid confusion, the MDE Program should have a separate prefix, as is the case with all the other CTE programs.

Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) – MOS is a stand-alone program with its own assignment code, V34, and associated MCCs. It has been added to be in alphabetical order.

Micro Homes Advanced Certification (MHAC) – Has been removed from the CTE section as it is not active and not available for students. Therefore, the MCCs are being removed.

Welding – Training Level 3, Certification Level 3, AWS Aluminum, and Stainless are removed because they are no longer required. The remainder of AWS descriptions are being changed as we can no longer use the AWS name for trademark reasons.

Roofing – This program is being removed due to the weak outlook in the job market. The skill is no longer in high demand. The program no longer meets the requirements in Penal Code section 2053.5.

eLearning – Course titles have been revised, or courses have been removed to accurately reflect available eLearning courses. Course type updated to reflect eLearning.

Core Programs – Criminal Thinking and Anger Management courses are no longer provided.

eReader – Course removed as the Step Down program is no longer offered.

Integrated Substance Use Disorder Treatment (ISUDT) Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (CBI) and Occupational Mentor Certification Program (OMCP)/Recruit – The removal of CBI completions is necessary to prevent duplicative MCC attribution and to ensure compliance with applicable reporting and accountability requirements. Eliminating CBI completions as a qualifying source of MCC is therefore required to ensure that each outcome is recorded a single time, to maintain auditable records, and to align program reporting with governing standards and oversight expectations.

Correctional Construction Mentorship (CCM) courses are added to Schedule 1. CCM integrates classroom instruction, hands-on construction training, industry-aligned module progression, mentorship from trained CDCR staff, and certification pathways relevant to California's construction labor market.

CCM milestone programs will increase access to trade skills and industry-validated construction training, enhance employability and work readiness, and expand opportunities aligned with California's labor market demand.

MCCS, Schedule 2 – Division of Adult Institutions (DAI)

Amendments are being made to the Alternatives to Violence Program (AVP). A previous change to these programs combined the separate parts of the course into a single, shorter course. The department has now determined that this course worked better before this change and is separating the course into its constituent parts as they were previously.

MCCS, Schedule 3 – California Correctional Training and Rehabilitation Authority (CALCTRA)

This schedule is changed to rename the former California Prison Industry Authority (CalPIA) to its new name of the California Correctional Training and Rehabilitation Authority (CALCTRA), pursuant to Penal Code section 2800. This is the only change to this schedule.
