TIMELINE AND MILESTONES

1990: AB 876 amends PC 2085.5 allowing CDCR to collect restitution fines from prison wages.

1988: California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) implements Office of Victim and Survivor Rights and Services (OVSRS).



2000: OVSRS received their first grant funding by Federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) to provide financial assistance to victims and victim's family attending parole suitability hearings.



010: CDCR began submitting all unpaid victim direct orders of restitution owed by a parolee or discharged offenders to the CA State Franchise Tax Board (FTB) for collection.

2011: CDCR-OVSRS implemented Victim Offender Dialogue Program.

2013: VSRIS and Offender Based Information System (OBIS) retired into Strategic Offender Management System (SOMS), a departmental wide coordination of all victim notes, contacts and information.

2016: VINE retired into SOMS Email Notification (victim notification of inmates release and acknowledgement letters). 2016: E1707, Electronic


submission for victims to request services (first front facing victim portal for CDCR, for the ease of victims requesting services).

2005: OVSRS is reorganized with Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) and Board of Parole Hearing (BPH). Victim Services and Restitution Information System (VSRIS) expanded DJJ programs available to all staff with 4D victim database and Ward Information Network (WIN).

2007: Trusted Restitution Accounting Canteen System (TRACS) was created which encompassed victim restitution, inmate banking and canteen services.

2008: CA approved Proposition 9, Marsy's Law, providing additional rights to victims.

2018: CDCR Inmate ID Locator, expanded and enhanced to advise victims and the public of release date and hearing date information.

Online registration system developed for offender family notices per PC 3058.65 (Dustin's Law)
